

Absentee Ballot

What is an absentee ballot:

An absentee ballot is for people who are registered to vote but are unable to attend the poles on Election Day.

Who is eligible to receive an absentee ballot:

- You must be 60 years of age or older.
- You expect to be absent from the community in which you are registered for the entire time the polls are open.
- You are physically unable to attend the polls without the assistance of another.
- You cannot attend the poles because of the tenets of your religion.
- You have been appointed an election precinct inspector in a precinct other than the precinct where you reside.
- You cannot attend the polls because you are confined to jail awaiting arraignment or trial.

How can I get an absentee ballot?

Absentee Ballots can be obtained by calling your Township offices at (517) 628-2093. You can also write to your local clerk requesting an absentee ballot or stop into the office during office hours to apply. Office hours are Tuesday thru Friday, 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

If you are in the military service or overseas you can contact your commanding officer and receive a Federal Post Card Registration and Absentee Ballot (FPCA). If you are a citizen overseas you can contact your Consulate Office.

How can I be put on the permanent absentee list?

Aurelius Township maintains a permanent absentee list. You can call or write your Township Office to be placed on this absentee ballot permanent list. The phone number is: (517)628-2093. The address is: Aurelius Township Hall, 1939 S. Aurelius Road, Mason, MI 48854.

After being placed on this list you will receive an application for an absentee ballot for every election. You will need to fill out, sign and return the application to receive your absentee ballot.
