

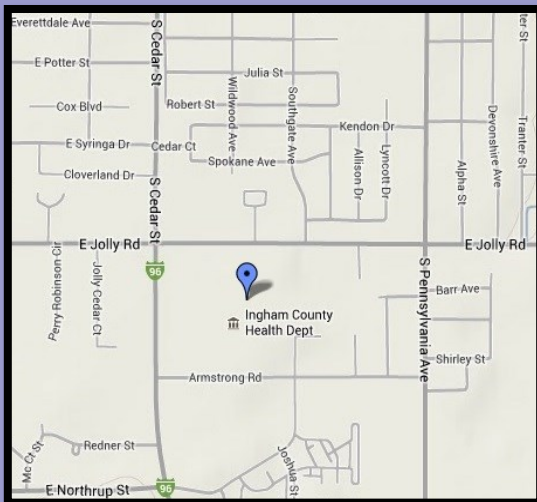

The Ingham County Household Hazardous Waste Collection is a **free** service for all residents of Ingham County

The collection began in 1987 as an option for residents to dispose of household hazardous materials that could be harmful to themselves and the environment

HHW will CLOSE for Holidays and Times of Inclement Weather

(Lightning, Heat Index 95^o+, High Winds, Tornado Warnings and Heavy Rain)



The Household Hazardous Waste Facility is located behind the Ingham County Health Department

Follow the “Household Hazardous Waste Collection” signs to the facility

For the safety of yourself and the workers, please follow the listed guidelines to get you on your way quickly and safely

- Observe entrance signs when approaching the facility
- Turn your **VEHICLE OFF** upon arrival and **REMAIN INSIDE** vehicle
- Keep all hazardous materials in containers; **NO TRASH BAGS**
- **NO SMOKING**; some materials are highly flammable
- **DO NOT** drop off any materials after hours or during times of inclement weather

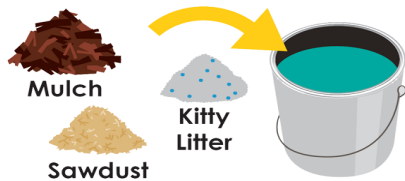

Proper Disposal of Latex Paint

★ Latex Paint is **NOT ACCEPTED** ★

Combine the paint with an absorbent material in a box lined with a trash bag and set out in the sun to dry out

Dispose in the regular trash once the paint is completely **dried out**



Safe Disposal of Medical Sharps

Suitable Containers: red medical waste containers, liquid laundry detergent bottles or plastic coffee containers

Unsuitable Containers: milk jugs, plastic juice containers, plastic bags or cardboard

ACCEPTED ITEMS

The following items must be generated from households within Ingham County. Small household businesses are not accepted.

Acids & Bases: ammonia, bleach, pool chemicals, toilet bowl cleaners

Aerosol Products

Antifreeze

Automotive Products: brake, steering, transmission fluid

Cleaners & Polishes

Flammables & Gasoline: be prepared to leave your gas container

Fluorescent Lights & Ballasts: removed from fixture

Fuel Oil

Home Cleaning Products

**** Mercury Containing Devices:** devices must be double sealed in baggies

Oil Based Paints & Paint Products: mineral spirits, stains, thinners

Pesticides, Herbicides & Fungicides

Photographic Chemicals

Sharps: epi-pens, lancets, needles

Small Propane Tanks: 1 pound only

Wood Preservatives

**** Mercury containing devices are accepted year round by appointment only**
